### MINUTES CENTRAL REGION CONFERENCE OCTOBER 7 & 8, 1995 KOKOMO, INDIANA

The Central Region Conference, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War and Auxiliary, was called to order October 7, 1995 at 2 PM in the Kelly Center of Indiana University, Kokomo. The meeting was called to order by Central Region Conference Commander Alan R. Loomis. He elaborated the remainder of the schedule of the meetings and events for the Conference.

Preparations were made for the opening ceremony with the selection of the following Department of Indiana members to fill vacant offices: Brother Gary Dolph, PDC, as Guide, Brother Ned Booher as Color Bearer, and Brother Stephen Jackson, Indiana Department Commander, as Junior Vice Commander. The opening was then conducted with the new Central Region Ritual.

The minutes of the 1994 Central Regions Conference were passed out, read, and corrected. Brother Grim moved that the minutes be approved as corrected and Brother

Braun seconded the motion. The motion was approved. The treasurer's report was given by Secretary Gill and was subject to audit by the auditing committee later.

The following correspondence was read by Conference Secretary Gill. Brother Thomas Johnson and sister Ellinore Johnson expressed their regrets for their absence due to illness. Brother Dave Turpin sent regrets because of illness. Brothers Hayes and Wallace sent regrets that they would be unable to attend due to the necessary completion of work related to the Sons of Union Veterans. Past Commander-in-Chief Kieth Harrison sent regrets due his work schedule.

Commander-in-Chief David Medert was introduced and presented his thoughts on items that need to be examined and action taken on now, or in the near future.

- 1. Reporting membership activities via newsletters, etc.
- 2. Encourage all units in the SUVCW have a regular newsletter or some form of communication among all members.
- 3. Establishment of Certificate of Appreciation to give members that perform special duties and outstanding activities.
- 4. Encourage Department Commanders to regularly communicate with the Department members so everyone knows what is going on.
- 5. Encourage more applications for the SUVCW Scholarship Fund, which few members have little or no knowledge.
- 6. "Fine Tune" the position of National Chief-of-Staff so that it becomes a functioning position rather than its present perception as an "honorary position."
- 7. Study the advertising budget to get the most out of the advertising dollar, and continue the investigation of possible advertising in the Banner in the form of promotional and classified ads.
- 8. Put together a National Membership list with an assigned computer number to give more flexibility in using the names for activities and genealogy work.
- 9. Update the Ritual Book and study ways for improvement of the Program and Policy Committee work in the SUVCW.

- 10. Design a special occasion card to send out on behalf of the Sons of Union Veterans.
- 11. Along with item 8, a special member data form to have a tie-in for filling special positions for SUVCW activities.
- 12. Study feasibility of having an 800 number for recruitment purposes.
- 13. Have all units of the SUVCW maintain a counselor position to handle legal and organizational problems.
- 14. Further refinement and updating job descriptions.
- 15. The need to index the C & R.
- 16. Refinement of the eligibility dates to receive the War Medal.
- 17. Keeping up to date on the Junior Program that was established at the 1994 National Encampment.
- 18. Setting up a program to go after "Unclaimed Property" that is duly owned by the Sons and Auxiliary by virtue of the G.A.R. deed of conveyance.
- 19. Getting the proper tax status through the Internal Revenue Service.
- 20. Encourage members that are computer literate to communicate by e mail.
- 21. Revise the requirements for Life Membership.
- 22. Encourage membership growth and establishment of new Camps and Departments.
- 23. Encourage all officers to fulfill the requirements of the office they occupy as outlined in the job description manual.
- 24 Explore and implement all practical methods of improving harmony among the five Allied Orders.

Sister Peggy Schaeffer brought greetings from the officers of the Auxiliary to the Central Region Conference. Central Region Conference Commander Loomis gave his report as National Senior Vice Commander-in-Chief, describing how he is placing ads in several National Magazines to increase membership of the SUVCW and the Auxiliary to the SUVCW. In addition, it was announced the Past Commander-in-Chief Clark Mellor had suffered a massive heart attack and is in grave condition.

Commander Loomis announced that he had been contacted by the chairman of a committee in Tuscola, Illinois, that is attempting to preserve a G A R room in the Douglas County Court House. The Department of Illinois has been informed and has become involved in the process of preserving the G A R room. This involvement appears to include the possibility of the formation of a new SUVCW camp in Tuscola.

Senior Vice Commander Kaup spoke about the activities in the Illinois Department including a visitation and donation to the Illinois Veterans Home, Departmental recruiting activities which includes dividing the Department into north and south recruiting regions, and the formation of Gen. Sheridan Camp # 2 in Aurora, Illinois. He also made a special note that the Department is planning a ceremony in Decatur, Illinois on April 14, 1996 for the 130th anniversary of the establishment of Post # 1 of the Grand Army of the Republic.

Department Commander Stephen Jackson talked about the Harrison Camp meeting taking place the next day at the War Memorial in Indianapolis. He indicated that the program would deal with the Battle of Perryville, Kentucky, which took place in October of 1862. Commander Jackson told about visiting the widow of Past Department Commander Orval King and retrieved the camp property of the Joseph E. Reynolds Camp # 251.

Commander Loomis outlined the details for the rest of the Conference before presenting the Saturday afternoon discussion of President Benjamin Harrison. Brother David Frye presented a twenty minute program about the subject of the discussion. Brother Robert Grim of Ohio added information about the Harrison family, particularly the children, and Sister Peggy Schaeffer included additional Harrison family details. The meeting was recessed in preparation for the Central Region Conference banquet which was also held in the Kelly Center of Indiana University at Kokomo.

The Central Regions Conference was called to order at 9:00 A. M. Sunday, October 8, 1995 in the Kelly Center, Indiana University, Kokomo. A brief Sunday morning service was present by Brother Ed Krieser with the reading of portions of Abraham Lincoln's presentation to the young men's Lyceum in Springfield. The service was followed by a discussion concerning the flag code. The discussion was lead by Central Region Conference Commander Loomis. The discussion was based on the Congressional Research Service's booklet "The United States Flag: Federal Law Relating to Display and Associated Questions".

The report from the Audit committee was that the treasurer's book was in order and they had signed the book to indicate their approval. A motion was made to accept the report, the motion was seconded and the motion was passed. The Resolutions committee gave its report which was seconded and passed. Following the passage of the Resolutions Committee report, the Secretary was instructed to send letters of appreciation to the Conference Chairman, Brother Gary Dolph, and to Somers Camp, Kokomo, Indiana, which was the host SUVCW Camp. A letter of appreciation was also sent to the Benjamin Harrison Camp in Indianapolis. The Nomination Committee gave their report followed by a short discussion. A motion was made to accept the Nomination Committee slate of officers. The motion was seconded and passed. The slate of officers is listed as follows:
