Brothers & Sisters:

One of the actions that came out of the 2015 meeting that we needed to address was ordering another set of Central Region Past Commanders badges. You may recall that the last of the original stock of past commanders badges was presented at last year's meeting. Bob Petrovic was tasked with identifying potential sources for the new badges and obtaining cost estimates. He sent me the following information based on his research and is requesting that the Central Region officers make a decision so he can place the order. Here is a summary of his findings...

Erffmeyer & Sons

- Produced the last set of past commanders medals
- They have the original die for the drops from the first set, but will need to create a die for the top bar.
- Estimated \$875 for 25 medals, plus \$16.25 for 25 plastic boxes.
- Estimate comes out to \$35 per medal, which likely includes the cost of the top bar die.
- Not very responsive in providing an estimate

Emblematics

- Lots of experience in working with this company
- No charge for the dies or any other set up charge
- 100 medals minimum....will not do an order of 25.
- Estimate of \$675 for 100 medals, plus \$150 for 100 plastic boxes.
- Estimate works out to \$6.75 per medal.
- Very responsive in providing estimate

Northwest Territorial Mint

- Some experience in working with this company
- \$300 charge for the dies
- Estimate of \$375 for 25 medals
- Estimate works out to \$15 per medal
- Total estimate of \$675 for the 25 medals, but did not include an estimate for plastic boxes
- Very responsive in providing estimate

None of these estimates are ideal as they all will put a big dent in the budget. Bob's recommendation is that we go with Emblematics but forego the plastic boxes for a total cost of \$675. In this case, we will not run out of medals again in our lifetime. He thinks it is silly to pay that much for only 25 medals. Bob also mentioned that we can get those small bubble wrap bags fairly cheap in order to store the medals. As a point of reference, Don Shaw estimates that there is about \$1200 in the treasury, so the cost can be absorbed.

In all cases, the lead time is 5 to 6 weeks once the design is approved, so if we are going to place an order to have medals ready by the first weekend in October, the order must be placed within the next couple of weeks.

Anyway, please let me know your thoughts.
